

The MARC board members along with Jamie Atchison and Maria Bingheim, 2023 Local Conference Co-Chairs and Judy Huntley, Registration Committee toured the hotel and conference center with Taylor Holmstrom, Sales Manager, Embassy Suites by HILTON, East Peoria, Illinois.

President Bonnie Templeton called the meeting to order at 10:12 AM and the Opening Ritual was recited.

Treasurer Brittany Rosenmund, ESA Foundation Chair Alley Gary, Secretary Amanda Rowland, Hope for Heroes Chair Jill Richards, Chaplain Julie Whitaker, Ways & Means Chair Kathleen Grissom, Local Conference Co-Chair Jamie Atchison and Marian Bingheim and local conference registration committee member Judy Huntley were in attendance.

Local Conference Co-Chairs Jamie Atchison and Maria Bingheim presented the Conference budget as well as the registration form for the MARC Conference in October. October 13-14th 2023. Attached please find the local conference report with detailed items discussed, and also the registration form, program ad form, and the budget. Rhonda Rawlings is the conference treasurer/registration chair for the ESA MARC 2023 Conference. Jamie will also send a room requirement and A/V request form to President Bonnie and other MARC board members to review the room set-up and A/V needs, the deadline will be August 1, 2023, to submit those.

Vice President Jill Shull, share her theme and logo, "On your MARC," it is still being developed, and is based on the MARC logo. Jill is working to fill her committees and noted that only one nomination form has been received to date, the submission deadline is June 15, 2023. Jill's focus is on communication, and she's plans to hold Zoom meetings with the executive board and MARC reps to keep the connection flowing.

Secretary Amanda Rowland motioned to dispense with the reading of the minutes as dispersed via email and Jill Shull, seconded. No discussion. Motion carried.

President Bonnie Templeton shared the proposed Bylaws and Standing Rule changes with the board, she asked Parliamentarian Heather Hoey to review and prepare them to submit to the membership for review, have them posted to the MARC website, and in the MARC Program book so members will be ready to vote on them at the October annual conference. It was suggested that, if needed, to find a meeting space to hold an open forum on Friday, October 13, after the leadership and before the mixer

for members with any concerns to discuss those in an open forum. Jamie Atchison will request from the hotel a room to meet and advise.

Treasurer Brittney Rosenmund provided the Treasurer's report, and the proposed budget was discussed.

Ways & Means Chair Kathleen Grissom suggested a few different ideas for the Ways and Means projects. She will take the boards feedback to her committee and present the projects once decided upon.

It was also suggested we bring back the MARC Marketplace and provide tables around the meeting room for those interested; it was noted that the items would need to be moved to a secure location overnight, there might be room in the registration office, however, the local committee is not responsible for moving these items.

Hope for Heroes Chair Jill Richards reported that Anita Dixon, Gold Star Mother and Patti Latch, Founder and Director of America's Gold star Families will be speaking on Saturday. Jill will be asking members to donate birthday cards and/or national chain gift cards for the children of the Gold Star families who have lost a parent.

ESA Foundation Chair Alley Gary reported \$771 was raised at the 2022 conference per the minutes, however, the balance online showed \$841 was donated per the Foundation report. She is unsure where the extra \$70 came from, perhaps it was collected after the conference and not part of the official minutes.

For the ESA Foundation fundraiser at the 2023 MARC Conference, Alley Gary will lead the Heads and Tails game with membership as a fundraiser to support the MARC scholarships.

Chaplain Julie Whitaker is contacting each state to get information for the celebration of life. Every state will need to send Julie the names of departed members for the celebration of life procession. President Bonnie Templeton shared the following correspondence:

From Pam Mitchell, Audit Chair with her suggestions to prepare for the audit. Pam would like to have copies sent to her quarterly of statements and transactions.

From Brenda Fields, Webmaster, requested everyone to check out the newly updated MARC website and advise any corrections or future ideas to keep the content up to date.

Closing Ritual was recited, and the meeting adjourned at 3:20 PM.

Greetings from Your MARC Hope for Heroes Team- Jill Richards, Brittany Covey, and Ruth Archambeau. We all are getting excited for MARC in Illinois and our committee is thrilled to have our speakers come and share their stories with us.



Our first guest will be Anita Dixon, mother of Sgt. Evan S. Parker US Army, who was killed in action. Evan was deployed to Iraq October 2004 from the 100-442 Battalion Schofield Barracks/Ft. Shafter Flats (487th), Honolulu Hawaii. Evan was a Field Intelligence Support Team (F.I.S.T.), responsible for locating and deactivating the Improvised Explosive Device (IED). She will be sharing her story and the story of her son who was killed in the line of duty while in Iraq in 2005. Anita is a Gold Star Mother and loves to share Evan's story, which is now her story, to help other Gold Star Mom's.



Our second guest is Patti Latch, Founder and Executive Director of Gold Star Families will be joining us and sharing her story and why she founded Central Illinois Gold Star Families. Gold Star Families serves those who have experienced any military loss through active-duty service from all branches of the US military, representing all conflicts. Bringing families of the fallen together to honor their sacrifice and provide hope and healing allows survivors to bond with others who have experienced a similar loss. Under Patti's leadership, the organization significantly expanded to provide services and programs to Gold Star Families across the nation: Birthday Cards for Children Program, Fallen Heroes Trees of Honor Program, and Scholarships for Military Dependents Program.



The Birthday Card for Children Program's mission is to provide Honor, Hope and Healing to the children who experienced the loss of a parent through active-duty military service and let them know they are not forgotten. After a child is registered through their website, on every birthday (through age 18), that child will receive a birthday card in the mail, signed by one of the Gold Star Families associates, along with a Wal-Mart Gift Card they can use to buy something special for themselves.

At MARC, our members are being asked to bring blank birthday cards with envelopes and Wal-Mart gift cards in the amount of \$20.00 to help wish those children of our fallen heroes Happy Birthday.

The Hope for Heroes Committee hope to see you all at MARC. We are eager to have these two remarkable women inspire us with their stories.

ESA: Supporting Heartspring through the Years

The Kansas State Council of Epsilon Sigma Alpha (ESA) has supported Heartspring as their State Philanthropic Project since the late 1940's raising more than \$650,000 for the children and families of Heartspring.

"The women of Epsilon Sigma Alpha have donated countless hours of service,

hundreds of thousands of charitable dollars, and gifts in kind, all to ensure the children of Heartspring receive top-of-the-line education, therapy, and the opportunity to be a kid," Director of Philanthropy Mandy Fleming said. "Their love and support for the children at Heartspring make them partners in every way."

The organization has been supporting Heartspring for about 80 years, but it

has been around since 1929 when a group of individuals came together in Jacksonville, Texas, to learn, grow and prepare themselves for an everchanging world. During World War II, they expanded to include philanthropic and public service projects participating in the United Service Organizations and The American Red Cross. They also were one of the first groups to support the March of Dimes. And, of course, the Kansas Chapter began its affiliation with Heartspring and have continued ever since.

"Many of our members shared with me that our continued support is due to

seeing what a difference Heartspring makes in these children's lives," Pam Mitchell, ESA KSC 2nd Vice President, said. "It takes very special people to do their work and it takes money to provide them with the teaching tools and equipment they need to make a difference." In addition to the funds raised, the women of ESA have participated in a number of different projects. Many participate in the Adopt A House/ Adopt A Classroom project where chapters send items monthly to the students of Heartspring. They also help put together some of our students' favorite activities---the Family Weekend and Day of Love Dance.


"It takes all of us in ESA to bring together these events," Mitchell said.

In addition to changing the lives of the children Heartspring serves, ESA has

also changed the campus that they live and grow on. They were integral in raising funds for the tree house, an outdoor learning space, that is still used today.

I find March to be a busy time. Whether it's getting ready for an ESA meeting or event, a family outing or just trying to catch up with friends, I usually have to plan a dish for the occasion. Here is one that I rely on because it is easy to make and a crowd favorite, because everyone loves bacon! Enjoy!

Maple Caramel Bacon Crack Bites

These Maple Caramel Bacon Crack Bites are bite-sized bits of heaven! Only 4 ingredients and SUPER easy to make. You can easily double or triple this recipe!

Prep Time	Cook Time	Total Time
15 mins	15 mins	30 mins

Course: Appetizer, Treats Cuisine: American Servings: 30 Author: Hayley Parker, The Domestic Rebel

Ingredients

- 2 (15 count pkgs) frozen phyllo cups (30 total)
- 1 lb regular-cut bacon any flavor/smoke preference, such as peppered, hickory-smoked, maple flavored, etc, but I would recommend not using thick-cut as it will be too heavy and big for the delicate phyllo cups, cut in half cross-wise
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup maple syrup I used pancake maple syrup, but real deal syrup will work

Instructions

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment and lightly grease it with cooking spray. Place the phyllo cups onto the baking sheet and set aside briefly.
- Fry the bacon in batches in a large skillet, cooking until the bacon is just about done but not crispy. The bacon should be on the chewier side, as it will continue to cook more as you bake it. Drain the bacon onto a paper towel-lined plate and let cool briefly before chopping into tiny bits.
- 3. Scoop a 1/2 tsp of brown sugar into each phyllo cup and add a small squirt of maple syrup on top. Fill past the brim of the phyllo cup with bacon, mounding it into the cup. Sprinkle with the remaining brown sugar.
- 4. Bake for approx. 12-15 minutes or until the phyllo cups and bacon are crisp and the maple caramel is bubbly and caramelized. Cool for about 5 minutes before serving.

Combine all ingredients and enjoy.


